Christmas Greeting – 2024

The poet WH Auden wrote in "For the Time Being" these words He is the Truth. Seek Him in the Kingdom of Anxiety; You will come to a great city that has expected your return for years.

Seek him in the Kingdom of Anxiety.....

Once again, we have before us a Christmas in a world that is anxious. People are stressed and cautious. We are nostalgic for Christmases past when "all was calm, all was bright." We long for the way things were.

Mary and Joseph lived in the Kingdom of Anxiety. They were teenagers, pregnant, having to pack up their belongings and head out on the road. Some of you can remember being pregnant or with little children and having to pack the car and head out on the road for 'home' for Christmas, to do your perceived or expected duty – NOT FUN. Exhaustion, snow, ice, and traffic brought great anxiety. Parents or friends awaiting our arrival were equally stressed. Everyone was in the "Kingdom of Anxiety."

At the same time, there were others who were equally anxious for different reasons. They wished that they would have a reason to be stressed, they wished that there were friends or family to await them, and they wished for the 'romanticised Hallmark Christmas feeling'. All the world seemed to live in the "Kingdom of Anxiety".

Our Church Family is presently trying to find our way in the Kingdom of Anxiety. What will be our future?

Like modern Palestinians trying to make it to Bethlehem for Christmas, the way forward seems laced with uncertainty. We don't know what the future will hold for us.

This is exactly like the first Christmas. Auden wrote, "*You will come to a great city that has expected your return for years".* Bethlehem, the City of David, awaited the return of a descendant of David for centuries. Bethlehem not only awaited – it expected – having nothing more to go on than promises made by God through the Prophets, especially Isaiah: "A young woman shall conceive and bear a son and you shall call him Emmanuel – God is with us".

Travelling through the Kingdom of Anxiety (that was as pressing as the times we are in) comes an unlikely pair, bearing all the weight that we feel and even more.

By the world's standards, Mary and Joseph were the lowest of the low and yet a great city was awaiting them, expecting them, and all of heaven was prepared for them. In the midst of that anxiety, a child was born. God was present. The truth of the matter is that God is always present in the midst of anxiety.

Even today, Christ is born not in Bethlehem but in every place we find ourselves; alone in an apartment, gathered with our own small family or gathered with a family of friends, or one of the few who are brave enough to venture out to greet strangers with the phrase – Christ is born for us.

Through all the anxiety of this world, God keeps his promise – I am with you – and I will come to you, dwell with you and be with you forever. "*A great city has expected your return".* Such a wonderful future awaits.

This is the truth of Christmas. God is with us – we are not alone.

Thank you for inviting me to join with you in ministry through the Fall.

Church envelopes If you haven't had contribution envelopes in the past and wish to have them for 2025, please advise the church office. Another way of making contributions is through PAR.

PAR: Pre-Authorized Remittance (PAR) is a convenient way to support the ongoing work of your church. Your monthly contributions are taken directly from your bank account or charged to a Major Credit Card. Currently we have 95 households using this method of support. Signing up for PAR takes only a few minutes and can be done for you at the church office. All that is required is a void cheque or your credit card number.

Property Maintenance Team

Snow removal from December 1, 2024 to March 31, 2025 will cost \$2,900, slightly higher than was quoted for last year. Outside of this contract period each trip will be charged on a per trip basis. The snow-blowing, shovelling and salting of the doorways will continue to be completed by the custodian.

The lease agreement between the Bathurst Community Market and First United Church for use of the Donald Eddy Memorial Hall on Saturday mornings from 8 AM to 1 PM continues and is running very well with the support from our congregation.

Thanks to the Faithful Footprints Grant Application we received funding from the United Church of Canada in the amount of \$17,360 to cover two-thirds of the cost of 1 fridge for the kitchen, heat pumps for the offices and LED lights and a new dishwasher, that was also installed in the kitchen as the old one was no longer functioning and parts were not available to repair.

Work on energy reduction is ongoing and with the installation of the above-mentioned items our energy use has been lower that in 2023.

Bathurst Pastoral Council Highlights

December 2, 2024

Council held its second meeting of the fall in the Ruth Morrison Room with Sandra Boone presiding and Brenda Parrott as secretary pro-tem. The meeting began with a Land Acknowledgement followed by prayer by Rev. Ivan Gregan.

In business arising from the minutes of October 29th, Lester Scott reported that livestreaming of Sunday services is in the offing.

The financial report, highlighted by Ian Oliver as Team Chair, showed a 2024 deficit of \$4,658 as of October 31st. Local givings totalled \$160,484 for the 10-month period including a \$25,000 bequest in February and \$2,450 in loose givings. Total revenue was \$238,752 including a United Church of Canada grant of \$17,361 towards repair work.

The combined choir concert on December 1st, organized by Martha Vickers, resulted in revenue of approximately \$1,700 which was shared equally between the First United and Central United churches. Thirty choristers took part including six Treble Makers under the directing of Linda Knowles MacPherson, five In Harmony singers, a duet by Isabel and John Clouston and a solo by Amada Godin. Martha mentioned that the Regional President, Sue LeMaistre, attended the concert as well as the regular church service earlier in the day.

The Christian Development Team reported there was more congregation participation for Orange Shirt Day this year. An update was given on the proposed youth group. The CD Team still needs a chairperson.

Wayne Lord reported the turkey supper in November showed a net income of approximately \$7,000. The next meal – roast pork – is tentatively set for February.

The Pastoral Care Team is looking for input from the congregation regarding persons in hospital or in need of a visit. The church office or team members should be notified of such needs. Bill Stack said the Hospitality and Friendship Team is eager and is looking for help in providing/serving refreshments following our regular church services. He expressed concern with the lack of acceptance at times towards newcomers to the church.

Reporting for the Property Management Team, Lester Scott said everything is "in good shape" for the winter. The late arrival of snow has helped the snow clearing budget.

The annual staff reviews are completed as reported by Wayne Lord. Wayne is impressed "by all our staff". He said arrangements are being completed for pulpit supply in January.

It was noted that Mission & Service needs more financial support in order to carry out its mandate across the church.

Reporting for the Communications Sub-Team, Isabel MacLaggan said bulletin board items for Remembrance Day have been replaced by the Advent Theme.

Another topic on the agenda was in regard to an "Affirming Congregation". Rather than delaying discussion until the next meeting, Rev. Ivan offered to conduct an introduction/information session, possibly following the December 15th church service.

It was noted that the dedication of the sound/video console during a recent church service was well done. The creatively crafted piece of furniture was donated by Ed and Sandra Boone in memory of Sandra's parents, John and Verna Watling and her sister, Judy.

The next council meeting is scheduled for Monday, February 10th at 4 PM.

Although not on the agenda, Rev Ivan gave a helpful memory tip on the seven liturgical seasons within the church. He suggested ACELEAP could stand for Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Ascension and Pentecost.
