<u>Church Envelopes</u> - If you haven't had contribution envelopes in the past and wish to have them for 2025, please advise the church office. Another way of making contributions is through PAR.

PAR - Pre Authorized Remittance (PAR) is a convenient way to support the ongoing work of your church. Your monthly contributions are taken directly from your bank account or charged to a Major Credit Card. Currently we have 94 households using this method of support. Signing up for PAR takes only a few minutes and can be done for you at the church office. All that is required is a void cheque or your credit card information.

Ways & Means Team

The Ways and Means team would like to express a sincere thank you to all who helped in anyway with our Sunrise breakfast as well as the suppers in 2024. The generous sponsorship of Jean Coutu (Beresford), Websolutions.ca, the Hatheway Group of Companies, Bayside Automotive, Kenny's Trucking, The Shine House (Division of Stothart Automotive) and McDonald's Restaurant (Bathurst) allowed the Ways & Means Team to generate just over \$23,000 overall last year.

Council Highlights from February 10th

Council met on February 10th with all members except one present. Sandra opened the meeting and Rev. Blair led in prayer.

A thank you letter was received from Atlantic School of Theology for our donation to the "Education for Everyone" program.

Dave Morison, who has now stepped down as Church Treasurer, presented the Income Statement and Balance Sheet to December 31, 2024. He also presented the 2025 budget which was approved by Council.

Local Givings came in at \$224,029 compared to a budgeted figure of \$176,500, a difference of \$47,529. Overall total revenue reached \$318,427. Expenses for 2024 went over budget by \$1,678. We received two substantial bequests in December leading to the Local Givings being higher than anticipated. Among other reasons for a positive financial picture was the revenue from the Bathurst Community Market, other rentals and the hard work of the Ways & Means Sub-Team preparing for and serving several eat-in/take-out suppers.

The Ways & Means Sub-Team, co-chaired by Wayne Lord, reported 300 tickets were printed for the Roast Pork Supper being held on February 20th and due to hygiene concerns, there will be servers at the sitdown meal versus people serving themselves.

Martha Vickers, our Regional Representative advised there were possible events being discussed for the Church 100-year celebration on June 10, 2025.

Isabel MacLaggan reported on behalf of the Pastoral Care team advising they are always in need of new members and Gwen Sturgeon continues to send out cards when needed from the church.

Rick Watling's Nominations report advised that Dorothy McCallum resigned her position on the Ways & Means team. We are still looking for persons to fill two vacancies on the Regional Council Team and chairperson for the Christian Development Team.

(Note – at the annual meeting Phyllis Davidson Allan has agreed to be one of our Regional Representatives and Martha Vickers and Anne Wilson will co-chair the Christian Development team. Joanne Wiseman has agreed to be secretary of this team as well. Julie and Harvey Spence have agreed to join the Pastoral Care team.)

The Christian Development Team reported very positive feedback was received from Rev. Gregan on his time spent with First United. The Chaleur Music Festival will be renting the sanctuary for a portion of their recitals.

Wayne Lord, on behalf of the Ministry and Personnel team, advised our new minister will be here on March 2^{nd} .

It was noted our Mission & Service Givings were down by \$1,000 from the budgeted amount.

The date for the Annual General Meeting of Bathurst Pastoral Charge will be set upon the arrival of Rev. David Allan.

The next council meeting will be held after the Annual General Meeting.

West Bathurst Cemetery Team

The West Bathurst Cemetery Committee is responsible for the upkeep of Saint Luke's "Old Scottish" Cemetery on St. Luke's Court which was established in the 1820's, and the West Bathurst Cemetery on St. Anne Street which dates back to the 1890's. Committee members are Robert Branch (Committee Chair), Heidi Jansson, Robert Willis, Byron Mclean, Lester Scott, and Gary Branch (Secretary).

The Financial Report for 2024 showed donations of \$1,387.95 were received from PAR donations and individual donations. Investment income totaled \$3,290.36 for a total revenue of \$4,678.31. Mowing and maintenance expenses totalled \$4,044.41 leaving a net income for the year of \$633.90. The committee extends a "thank you" to Dave Morison for his years as treasurer looking after our finances and wish him well as he retires. We also extend a warm welcome to Alberta Buttimer who has taken on the role of treasurer.

The West Bathurst Cemetery Committee will be meeting soon to plan for the upcoming mowing and maintenance season. In addition to "Spring Clean – up," priorities for St. Luke's include gravestone and fence repair. The "to do" list for West Bathurst Cemetery may include further tree removal of trees damaged by the fire at Eddy's last May as well as some gravestone repair.

The West Bathurst Cemetery Committee extends a special "thank you" to Margaret "Bonnie" Scott for her recent generous donation to the West Bathurst Cemetery and another to First United Church in memory of her mother, Jean Farquharson; her sister – in law, Anna Liisa Farquharson; and her brother, Graham Farquharson who are buried in West Bathurst Cemetery. Her brother, Graham, who died in 2022, was a Member of the Order of Canada and a generous benefactor of the West Bathurst Cemetery. Appreciation is also expressed to everyone who continues to support the West Bathurst Cemetery though PAR donations or by dropping off a donation at the church office.

Orange Cookies

Batter Ingredients

- 2 1/2 Cups Flour
 - 1 Tsp. Baking Powder
 - ¹/₄ Tsp. Salt
 - 1 Cup Granulated Sugar
 - 2 Tbsps. Orange Zest
 - 1 Cup Unsalted Butter
 - 2 Tbsps. Fresh Orange Juice
 - 1 Egg

Glaze Ingredients

- 1 ¹/₂ Cups Powdered Sugar
 - 1 Tbsps. Orange Zest Fresh Orange Juice
- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. Line 2 cookie sheets with parchment paper or silicone mats

Make the cookies -

- In a medium bowl whisk together flour, baking powder and salt. Set aside.
- 3. In a small bowl combine sugar and orange zest rubbing them together with fingers until zest is completely incorporated into the sugar.
- 4. Using an electric mixer on medium speed cream butter and orange infused sugar until light and fluffy about 3 minutes. Add the egg and orange/sugar mixture until combined, scraping the sides of the bowl as needed. Reduce speed to low and gradually add the dry ingredients mixing until just combined. *If the dough is a bit soft refrigerate for up to 30 minutes.*
- Using medium cookie scoop (2 tbsps.) scoop out dough and roll into balls placing 2" apart. Bake for 10 to 12 minutes or until lightly brown at edges.

Let cool 5 to 10 minutes before moving to the rack.

Make the glaze -

6. Whisk together powdered sugar and orange zest and orange juice to desired consistency. Spread over the cookies and set at room temperature for at least 30 minutes.
